





## MCSL Annual Update Report July 2019 – June 2020

## About MCSL

MCSL is a registered charity and community-focused organization, education Centre and model for the promotion of sustainable technology and living practices in homes and businesses. The Centre provides practical education on renewable energy production, energy and water efficiency, waste management and recycling, biodiversity through green space management and chemical-free vegetable production.

MCSL offers community education workshops, school excursions, professional development training for educators, pre-school programs, sustainable barista training, tours, venue hire and runs projects that build social capacity and empower individuals to practice sustainable lifestyles. MCSL supports the global Sustainable Development Goals.









#### Status of MCSL

While Campbelltown City Council remains the most significant financial contributor to the operations of the Centre, Camden and Wollondilly Shire Councils have provided or are committed to providing further funding for the 2020-21 financial year.

The pandemic has had a major effect on all aspects of the charity's activities resulting in the cessation of onsite activities from late March 2020. MCSL's ongoing operations have been made possible through pandemic related government programs and financial support.

MCSL continued to show year-on-year revenue growth up to March 2020, especially in its school excursions and community workshops programs.

The MCSL Board would like to express their admiration for the way staff pivoted to alternative methods to continue the charity's mission by providing online education resources to maintain connection to the Centre's many followers (e.g. YouTube videos, Zoom presentations). Staff also utilized this time to rewrite workshop factsheets and review existing programming. It is very pleasing to work with such dedicated and capable staff.

The pandemic will continue to affect MCSL's activities in 2020-2021 and the Centre will need to remain flexible as it works through the challenges created by the pandemic.

#### **MCSL Activities**

MCSL's visitor rate for the year was 13,340 casual visitors with very few visitors in the last quarter due to pandemic restrictions. However, there has been a steady stream of visitors using the recently installed Return & Earn kiosk, and a small, but consistent, use of the newly installed EV charger. MCSL's volunteer program remains strong with a total of 19,530 Volunteer hours recorded.

MCSL workshops continued to book up quickly with the Centre running 28 Campbelltown CC Saturday workshops, 8 Campbelltown CC Library Community workshops, 15 Campbelltown CC School Holiday workshops, 3 Camden Council Saturday workshops, 2 Camden Council Staff workshop, and 5 MCSL Specialised workshops, at the Centre. The School holiday program alone reached approx. 320 children plus parents.

The Centre continues to reach more residents with just over 30% of workshop participants attending MCSL for the first time.





MCSL continues to run a nationally accredited barista certification course in partnership with a local RTO, the Macarthur Travel, Tourism & Event College (MTTEC).

Significant maintenance was carried out on site in 2019-20. Maintenance of the site is continuous with the Centre's aging infrastructure. Maintaining the buildings and the 5 hectares site is a big task for the staff and volunteers.

Staff upgraded their TAE certification to enable MCSL to continue running our accredited barista courses on site. Staff upgraded First Aid and CPR qualifications, Bee Keeping Bio Courses, Mushroom Growing Courses, undertook Governance training and are currently studying a Diploma in Sustainable Living through the University of Tasmania. Staff attended the Australian Association of Environmental Educators Conference, KNSWB Sustainable City conference and the NSW Litter Conference, both to promote the Centre & to enable staff to stay up to date with sustainable developments.

The Centre obtained NESA Certification, enabling MCSL to offer Professional Development courses to local teachers to assist them in covering sustainability in the NSW curriculum (cross-curricular subject).

The Centre promotes our own workshops and events plus many other local events via its Facebook & Instagram pages. Our Facebook site has increased to over 3,600 followers with MCSL web site achieving over 460, 000 hits over the 12 months.

MCSL made 12 Little Explorers YouTube videos for Art and Craft activities and 11 MCSL YouTube videos. The most popular were How to Set up a Commercial Worm Farm, and the Chef and the Gardener – Cooking with Seasonal Produce. More videos are planned, and Campbelltown City Council have approached MCSL to more short videos focused on waste management.

Staff also became skilled in using Zoom for MCSL Board meetings, catch up with Council staff, MCSL staff meetings and Little Explorers children and parents' activities.

The Centre became more involved in Emergency Food relief by collecting food from Dignity and Big Yellow Umbrella to feed our volunteers or to process to assist with food waste avoidance. Approximately 20-30 litres of food waste is recycled in the
