Status of MCSL

While Campbelltown City Council remains the most significant financial contributor to the operations of the Centre, Camden and Wollindilly Shire Councils have provided or are committed to providing further funding. With this financial involvement of the three LGAs and the growth of the Centre's own income streams the future for MCSL is in a much stronger position to fulfil its mission.
